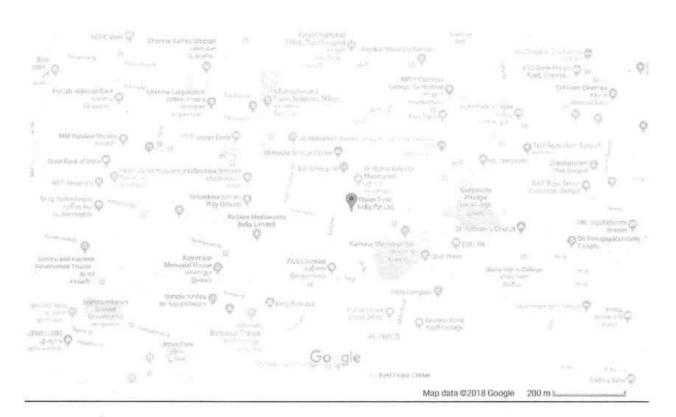

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of M/s. Vision Time India Private Limited Company ("the company"), which comprises the Balance Sheet as at 31st March 2023, the Statement of Profit and Loss, Statement of Cash Flow for the year ended and Notes to the Financial Statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, except for the effect of the matter described in the Basis for qualified opinion section of our report, the aforesaid financial statements give the information required by the Companies Act, 2013 in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at March 31, 2023, and its profit and its cash flows for the year ended on that date.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

The company has not created Gratuity Provision for the year, which is not in line with Accounting Standards 15 as specified under Section 133 of Companies Act. 2013, Reference is invited to Note no. 2(g) of the Significant Accounting Policies and Note no.33 of the Other Explanatory Notes. We are unable to comment on the implications of the above qualification thereof, the consequential effect arising out of the same in Financial Statements. Reference is invited to Note no 2(g) of the Significant Accounting Policies, with respect to

registration under Employees Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 and Employees' State Insurance Act, 1948.

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013. Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section* of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the *Code of Ethics* issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements under the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and the Rules there under, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified opinion.

Information Other than the Financial Statements and Auditor's Report Thereon

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the other information. Other information does not include the financial statements and our auditor's report thereon. Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial statements or our knowledge obtained in the audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

If, based on the work we have performed on the other information obtained prior to the date of this auditor's report, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, we are required to report that fact. Reporting under this section is not applicable as no other information is obtained at the date of this auditor's report.

Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the matters stated in section 134(5) of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") with respect to the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance, and cash flows of the Company in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the accounting Standards specified under section 133 of the Act. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, the Board of Directors is responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the Board of Directors either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so. The Board of Directors are also responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by management.
- Conclude on the appropriateness of management's use of the going concern basis of accounting and, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the Company's ability to continue as a going concern. If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial statements or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Company to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements, including the
 disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a
 manner that achieves fair presentation.
- Materiality is the magnitude of misstatement in the financial Statements that, individually or in aggregate, makes it probable that the economic decisions of a reasonably knowledgeable user of the financial statements may be influenced. We consider quantitative materiality and qualitative factors in (i) planning the scope of our audit work and in evaluating the results of our work; and (ii) to evaluate the effect of any identified misstatement in the financial statements.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

VISION TIME INDIA PRIVATE LIMITED

Significant Accounting Policies:

1. Disclosure of Accounting Policy (ICDS -1):

Presentation and disclosure of financial statements

- The Financial Statements have been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles in India under Historical cost convention on accrual basis. The entity follows the mercantile system of accounting and recognizes income and expenditure on an accrual basis.

- Employees are entitled only to short term benefits such as salaries, wages. These
 are accounted as an expense in the year the services are rendered to the extent
 of amount expected to be paid on an undiscounted basis and recognized as a
 liability to the extent unpaid.

2. Revenue Recognition (ICDS -4):

(a) Rendering of Services:

- Advertising income are recognized when the related commercial or programme is telecasted. The assessee has recognized revenue from service transactions to the extent of Rs. during the year.

NOTE 1: CORPORATE INFORMATION

a) Background

Vision Time India Private limited is a private limited company domiciled in India and incorporated on 17th June, 2006 under the provisions of the Companies Act, 1956 with Registrar of Companies, Tamilnadu vide CIN No.U74300TN2002PTC049150. Its shares are not listed in stock exchanges in India. The company consists of five divisions namely Vision Time, Vision Pro Event Management, Sun Vision Media Services, Trendloud and Trend music. Vision Time is engaged in the business of Advertising and Free Commercial Time Marketing and Vision Pro Event Management is carrying on the business of Event Management. Sun Vision Media Services is carrying on the business rendering services in connection with Advertisement. Trend music and Trendloud are divisions established to provide services established to cater to specific subsections of the media and marketing business, and they provide specialized marketing solutions in both the traditional and digital space.

b) Comparatives

All amounts in the financial statements are presented in Indian Rupees (in lakhs). Figures for the previous year have been regrouped / re-classified wherever considered necessary to conform to the figures presented in the current year.

NOTE 2: SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a) Basis of Accounting

Financial Statements are prepared under the historical cost convention on accrual basis, in accordance with the generally accepted accounting policies in India and to comply with the Accounting Standards prescribed under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 (as amended) and the pronouncements of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. All assets and liabilities have been classified as current or non-current as per the Company's operating cycle and other criteria set out in the Schedule III to the Companies Act, 2013. Assets and liabilities are classified as current or non-current as per Company's normal operating cycle and the criteria set out in the Schedule III to the Act. Based on the nature of work, the Company has ascertained its operating cycle as up to twelve months for the purpose of current and non-current classification of assets and liabilities. The Management evaluates all recently issued or revised Accounting Standards on an ongoing basis.

b) Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities on the date of financial statements and the results of operations during the reporting periods. Significant estimates include provision for doubtful receivables and loans and advances, Income taxes, future obligations under employee benefit plans and estimated useful life of tangible/intangible assets. Although these estimates are based upon management's knowledge of current events and actions, actual results could differ from those estimates and revisions, if any, are recognized in the current and future periods.

c) Property, Plant and Equipment and Depreciation

Property, Plant and Equipment are stated at acquisition cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses, if any. Cost of acquisition comprises of purchase price and directly attributable costs of bringing the asset to its working condition for the intended use and is net of refundable duties and taxes as applicable. Cost of Property, Plant and Equipment not ready for the intended use before such date is disclosed as capital work in progress.

Subsequent expenditure incurred on an item of Property, Plant and Equipment is added to the book value of that asset only if this increases the future benefits from the existing asset beyond its previously assessed standard of performance.

Gains or losses that arise on disposal or retirement of an asset are measured as the difference between net disposal proceeds and the carrying value of an asset and are recognized in the statement of profit and loss when the asset is derecognized.

Depreciation on assets is provided on written down value method over the useful life of the asset at the rates and manner prescribed in Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013.

d) Intangible Assets and Amortization

Intangible assets acquired separately are measured on initial recognition at cost. Intangible assets are carried at cost less accumulated amortization and accumulated impairment losses, if any. Intangible Assets are written off over its useful life (4 years).

Music rights acquired on outright basis, wherein the future economic benefits are established are capitalized. Cost incurred in Trendloud in the nature of Content production Cost are expensed off in the year in which the Programme is streamed in the internet platform and not capitalized since the content will generate revenue for a short span of a few months.

e) Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the revenue can be reliably measured.

- Advertising income is recognized when the related commercial or program is telecasted.
- Interest income is recognized on time proportion basis.

f) Foreign currency transactions

Initial recognition

Foreign currency transactions are recorded in the reporting currency, by applying to the foreign currency amount the exchange rate between the reporting currency and the foreign currency at the date of the transaction.

Conversion

Foreign currency monetary items are retranslated using the exchange rate prevailing at the reporting date. Non- Monetary items, which are measured in terms of historical cost denominated in a foreign currency, are reported using the exchange rate at the date of the transaction. Non-monetary items, which are measured at fair value or other similar valuation denominated in a foreign currency, are translated using the exchange rate at the date when such value was determined.

g) Retirement and Other Employees Benefits

- 1. The Company has not made Provisions for Gratuity.
- The Company has not created any provisions under Employees Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 and contribution towards Employees' State Insurance Corporation set up under the Employees' State Insurance Act, 1948
- 3. The company is required to be registered under Employees Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 and Employees' State Insurance Act, 1948. In view of the non-registration as per the above said Acts, the provisions regarding Provident Fund and ESIC are not complied with.

h) Borrowing Costs

Borrowing costs that are attributable to the acquisition or construction of qualifying assets are included as part of cost of such assets. A qualifying asset is one that necessarily takes a substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use. All other borrowing costs are charged to the profit and loss account as incurred.

i) Earnings per share

The basic earnings per equity share ("EPS") is computed by dividing the net profit / loss after tax for the year attributable to equity shareholders by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year. For the purpose of diluted earnings per share, the net profit / loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the period are adjusted for effects of all dilutive potential equity shares.

j) Taxation

The current charge for income taxes is calculated in accordance with the relevant tax regulations. Deferred Tax is accounted in accordance with AS 22 Accounting for Taxes and Income which includes current tax and deferred tax. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are recognized for the future tax consequences attributable to timing differences that result between accounting income and tax income of each entity of the group. Deferred tax in respect of timing differences which originate during tax holiday period but reverse after the tax holiday period is recognized in the period in which the timing difference originate. For this purpose, the timing difference which originates first is considered to reverse first. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are measured using the tax rates and tax laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date. The effect on deferred tax assets and liabilities of a change in tax rates is recognized in the period that includes the enactment date. Deferred tax assets on carried forward losses, are only recognized to the extent that there is virtual certainty that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realized.

Unrecognized deferred tax assets of earlier years are re-assessed and recognized to the extent that it has become reasonably certain that future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realized.

The Company offsets deferred tax assets and deferred tax liabilities if the Company has a legally enforceable right to set off assets against liabilities representing current tax.

k) Impairment of Assets

Wherever events of changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying value of Assets may be impaired, the Company subjects such assets to a test of recoverability, based on discounted cash flows expected from use or disposal there off. If the assets are impaired, the company recognizes as impairment loss as the difference between the carrying value and fair value less costs to sell. None of the company's assets are considered impaired as on the Balance Sheet date.

l) Provisions, Contingent Assets & Contingent Liabilities

The Company creates a provision when there is a present obligation as a result of an obligation / event that probably requires an outflow of resources and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. A disclosure for contingent liability is made when there is a possible obligation that may but probably will not require an outflow of resources. Where there is a possible obligation in respect of which the likelihood of outflow of resources is remote, no provision or disclosure is made.

m) Cash Flow Statement

The cash flows from operating, financing and investing activities of the Company are segregated based on the available information. Cash and Cash Equivalents comprises of cash on hand and demand deposits with banks. Cash equivalents are short-term balances (with an original maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition), highly liquid investments that are readily convertible into known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

n) Segment Reporting

Vision Time India Private Limited has the following Segments Vision Time India, Trendmusic, Trendloud, Vision Pro Event Management and Sun Vision.

Vision Time India is alone identified as a reportable segment. (Refer Note No. 34)
